Minnesota Multi-county, Multi-type Library Systems



The seven multi-county, multi-type library systems function as an intermediary between all types of libraries, ensuring that resources are shared and cooperation occurs among all library types, including academic libraries, public libraries, school libraries, and special libraries in Minnesota. Through library cooperation and resource sharing, Minnesotans receive the best library service possible, in the most efficient manner. Each multi-county, multi-type system is as unique as the libraries they serve.

The multi-county, multi-type library systems in Minnesota are:

The seven multi-county, multi-type library systems in Minnesota are mandated by Minnesota Statute 134.351 to develop and maintain services including, but not limited to, "referral of users, intra-system reciprocal borrowing, cooperative collection development, cooperative reference services, staff development, research and development, cooperative storage facilities, and publicity and community relations". There are twelve regional public library systems in Minnesota that serve public libraries, while the seven multi-type systems serve all types of libraries. Each system has its own governing board. The five goals outlined in Minnesota Statute 134.351 for multi-county, multi-type systems include:

- Share Resources Among all Participating Libraries
- Provide Long-range Planning for Cooperative Programs
- Develop a Delivery System for Services and Programs
- Development of a Bibliographic Database
- Maintain a Communications System Among all Cooperating Libraries

Multi-county, Multi-type Library Systems in Minnesota do the following:

Develop Library Staff Professionally.

- Administer continuing education grants for library staff.
- Teach librarians about new library resources.
- Teach new technologies.

Improve Local Library Collections.

- Support interlibrary loan services.
- Support union catalogs.
- Find cost-effective eBook solutions.

Sponsor and Support Funding for Libraries.

- Write and receive grants that support libraries.
- Raise funds for libraries.
- Share library resources.

Champion for Libraries.

- Meet with library stakeholders.
- Meet with legislators on behalf of libraries.
- Publicly promote libraries.

Create, Develop, and Maintain Library Programs that Enrich the Lives of Minnesotans.

- Sponsor literacy initiatives through programs, conferences, and workshops.
- Facilitate improved library services.

Move the Discipline of Library and Information Science Forward.

- Provide leadership in library organizations and associations.
- Present at conferences and publish articles in the library literature.
- Collect and analyze library data.

Lead and Administer Agency.

- Manage human resources.
- Design and implement strategic plans.

Northern Lights Library Network

Northern Lights Library Network covers a geographic region of 26,950 square miles (the State of Minnesota covers a total of 86,939 miles) that includes the following twenty-three counties: Becker, Beltrami, Cass, Clay, Clearwater, Crow Wing, Douglas, Grant, Hubbard, Kittson, Mahnomen, Marshall, Norman, Otter Tail, Pennington, Polk, Pope, Red Lake, Roseau, Stevens, Traverse, Wadena, and Wilkin.

The Northern Lights Library Network system consists of four regional public library systems; academic libraries on two campuses of the University of Minnesota at Crookston and Morris; Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System institutions including Minnesota State University Moorhead, Bemidji State University, Northland Community College, Minnesota State Community and Technical College on four campuses (Moorhead, Thief River Falls, Wadena, and Fergus Falls); three tribal colleges, including Leech Lake, Red Lake, and White Earth; numerous private colleges; one hundred eighty five school libraries (including public and charter schools, Bureau of Indian Affairs schools, and private schools) in seventy-nine school districts; and a rich variety of special libraries in museums, county law libraries, hospitals, and early childhood programs.

Northern Lights Library Network (NLLN) is a cooperative system of two hundred eighty academic, public, school, and special libraries in twenty-three counties in North-central, North-west, and West-central Minnesota, that works at the grassroots level to bring together all types of libraries and collections in the region to discover, enhance, and share resources through administrative, technological, and educational support. NLLN:

- Provides scholarships to library staff for continuing education activities
 - ▶ Sponsors workshops and continuing education events
 - ▶ Provides directories of services in the region (see nlln.org)
 - Writes grants to support library services in the region
- Consults with rural school libraries on collection management and development,

including online catalog support

▶ NLLN creates, develops, and maintains the following programs:

Library Luncheon with Legislators where librarians from the region briefly describe their work to legislators over a shared lunch;

The Life Achievement Award signifies a contribution to citizens in the region from a librarian who has given extraordinary service throughout a career;

Minnesota Literacy Initiative supports literacy initiatives among all types of libraries, from early reading activities to advanced literary discussions, library literacy initiatives bring people together to get to know books in enjoyable and satisfying situations;

Poets Across Minnesota encourages the love of reading, literature, and the spoken word by sponsoring poetry readings and events for regional poets through libraries in the region; Train-the-Trainers is based on practical adult learning principles linked to skill building, for librarians in the region to assist them in keeping up with rapidly changing technology; LARL/NWRL Overdrive School Initiative, eBook access for middle and high school students by encouraging schools, teachers, and students to register for LARL and NWRL library cards to access the eBook services provided to them through their public library.

Prairielands Library Exchange

Serves Big Stone, Chippewa, Cottonwood, Jackson, Kandiyohi, Lac Qui Parle, Lincoln, Lyon, McLeod, Meeker, Murray, Nobles, Pipestone, Redwood, Renville, Rock, Swift, and Yellow Medicine counties.
